#### VICE PRESIDENT JOE BIDEN'S ENDORSEMENT OF AB 5

ASSEMBLYMAN KEVIN KILEY RESPONDS TO VICE PRESIDENT JOE BIDEN'S ENDORSEMENT OF AB 5

SACRAMENTO - Today Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin), author of the bill to Repeal AB 5, released the following statement in response to Vice President Joe Biden's endorsement of the new California law:

"Vice President Biden's tweet endorsing AB 5 focuses entirely on a ballot initiative by Uber, Lyft, and DoorDash. This suggests he was not properly briefed on the wider impact of the law, which has destroyed the livelihoods of professionals in several hundred industries.

"AB 5 goes against the core values of both political parties. National figures like the former Vice President should be encouraging state lawmakers to stand up for those values

and break free of the uniquely strong influence of special interests at the California Capi-

On February 27, the California State Assembly rejected a motion by Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) to suspend AB 5 while the Legislature considers at least 34 pieces of corrective legislation introduced

by members of both parties. Last week Kiley announced a new bill, AB 2075, to provide a Grace Period for AB 5 compliance through the rest of 2020. This minimal relief has been requested by countless businesses and independent contractors who are currently navigating how to comply with AB 5.

The nonpartisan Legislative

Analyst's Office has estimated that AB 5 affects 1 million Californians. For a sampling of these effects, see the book of AB Stories compiled by Assemblyman Kiley's office in January. Assemblyman Kevin Kiley represents the 6th Assembly District, which includes the Sacramento, Placer, and El DoraDO County communities of Cameron Park, El Dorado Hills, Fair Oaks, Folsom, Granite Bay, Lincoln, Loomis, Orangevale, Penryn, Rocklin, Roseville, and

Sheridan.



## Orangevale Cooks

by Suzanne Feblowitz

I just picked up a magazine and there was an article about Irish whiskey and realized that I had a recipe using Irish Whiskey! My niece, Kelly, brought this cake to a family gathering a few years ago and I thought this might be the perfect recipe to bring to your family gatherings this month and next month. It could be the perfect dessert on St. Patrick's Day.

#### KELLY'S IRISH WHISKEY CAKE

1 package yellow or chocolate cake mix

1 (3.4 ounce) package instant vanilla or French vanilla or chocolate pudding and piefilling mix

3/4 cup Irish whiskey or bourbon, divided

1/2 cup cooking oil

4 jumbo or extra large eggs, at room temperature

3/4 cup granulated sugar 1/4 cup butter or margarine

1/4 cup water

1 teaspoon lemon juice

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, combine cake mix, pudding mix, 1/2 cup Irish whiskey, and oil, add eggs and beat at medium speed of an electric mixer for 4 minutes, scraping sides of bowl as necessary. Spoon into a greased and floured 10-inch Bundt or tube pan. Bake for 45 minutes, or until a cake tester comes out clean. When cake is almost done, prepare syrup.

Combine sugar, butter, water, and lemon juice in a small heavy saucepan. Bring to a boil slowly, stirring until sugar is dissolved. Remove from heat and stir in remaining 1/4 cup Irish whiskey or bourbon.

Turn cake out onto two large sheets of aluminum foil placed together to form the shape of a cross. Let cake cool for 10 minutes, top side up for tube cake and upside down for Bundt cake. Using a skewer or long bamboo pick, make holes all over top and sides of hot cake. Drizzle syrup very slowly over cake. Bring foil up around cake and wrap securely. Cake may be served when completely cool, or stored in an airtight container overnight. Cake may be wrapped securely in foil and stored in the refrigerator for several weeks or in a freezer for up to six months.

Lyndon's wife, Bette, states "It has been a blessing to watch the reunion and friendship grow between Lyndon and Bob, I'm only sorry it didn't happen sooner."

Bob and Lyndon travel to see each other every few months and enjoy their time together immensely.
