



THE LEGISLATURE MUST GET TO WORK FOR CALIFORNIANS

On August 31, the California Legislature adjourned for the year. While that timing is ordinary, this year is anything but: our state faces staggering challenges, and the Legislature already missed more than two months during the pandomia

That's why I asked the Governor to call a Special Session of the Legislature. Twenty other lawmakers joined my letter, but there is still no word from the Governor. If anything, he has indicated he is leaning against the idea.

In a regular year, many may be thankful for a reprieve from some of the harmful policies coming our Legislature. But as things now stand, the people of California simply cannot be left without a voice in our government for four months as they cope with the harmful effects of school closures, business restrictions, and COVID-19.

Our regular Legislative Session was cut short by nine weeks, a 30 percent reduction to our traditional legislative calendar. This truncated calendar was used as a reason for not acting on legislation to protect the livelihoods of workers, provide relief to small businesses, and reform the Employment Development Department (EDD). This not only undermined the democratic process of the institution, but also deprived countless Californians of critical relief in a time of historic need.

A Special Session of the Legislature should focus on these unaddressed policy issues and provide oversight over the Executive Branch to make the Legislature a co-equal partner in decisions that impact the lives of 40 million Californians. Specifically, the session would be limited to:

First, evaluating the Governor's Executive Orders and providing oversight. Since the State of Emergency was declared in early March, Governor Newsom has signed 54 Executive Orders unilaterally changing over 400 laws. This is unprecedented. The Legislature must restore checks and balances and give Californians representa-

tion in their own government.

Second, passing a real small business relief bill. While the Governor embraced one of my proposals to provide a tax exemption for small businesses who received PPP loans, he also signed legislation adding burdensome new regulations. Our state needs to provide regulatory relief to spur economic growth, not just minor new exemptions that barely scratch the surface.

Third, fixing the EDD. The agency has failed millions of Californians

and recently announced that it will stop accepting unemployment claims altogether while the Department "resets." This debacle has exposed our state's massive bureaucracy as archaic, rigid, and in the thrall of special interests. While I support an emergency audit of EDD, we must follow up the audit with real change. We need a whole new paradigm where government is modern, performance-based, and at the service of Californians

Fourth, assessing the evidence on school and business closures and working towards a full and safe reopening and recovery. The rules and metrics for reopening have changed several times already. The Legislature must take a more active role in applying an evidence-based approach that is mindful of our state's diversity, so our communities are not needlessly held back.

The impact of our state's response to COVID-19 is not taking a break. The Legislative Branch of our government shouldn't either.





Orangevale Cooks

Just today my college friend sent me a text message about how she just made a favorite family recipe of mine. Burrito Pie was a dish that my motherin-law would make on a regular basis. I have not made this in several years and I am not sure why we neglect our favorites, but it seems to happen. I think we tend to get busy and make things that are quick and easy. This dish has a few more steps than just frying up tortillas for tacos, but the end result is worth the extra steps. I think the flour tortillas add a nice texture and flavor to the recipe.

EDNA'S "BURRITO" PIE

½ cup oil

4 (8 inch) flour tortillas

½ lb. ground beef

1 medium onion, diced 1 small garlic clove, minced

1 (4 oz.) can chopped green chilies, drained

1 (8 oz.) can refried beans 1/3 cup hot taco sauce

¼ tsp. salt ½ lb. Monterey Jack cheese, shredded (2 cups)

1 cup shredded lettuce

1 medium tomato, diced

5 large, pitted ripe olives, sliced

In a 10 inch skillet, over medium heat, in hot oil, fry 1 tortilla at a time about 30 seconds on each side, until lightly browned and blistered. With tongs, remove tortilla to paper towels to drain. Discard oil after use.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In same skillet, over high heat, cook ground beef, onion, and garlic until all pan juices evaporate and meat is well browned, stirring occasionally. Remove skillet from heat. Stir in green chilies, refried beans, taco sauce, and salt.

In a 9-inch pie plate, place 1 tortilla; top with ¼ of the bean mixture and ¼ of the cheese. Repeat 3 times. Bake pie 30 minutes or until heated through. Sprinkle pie with lettuce, tomatoes, and olives. Makes 6 main dish servings.

My friend, Kathy, suggests sprinkling with chopped cilantro and slices of avocado. She also makes this a little lighter by toasting up the tortillas in a heavy cast iron pan instead of frying.




