

TWIN LAKES RIDING CLUB OF ORANGEVALE

On November 1, 1961, seven interested families from the Orangevale area joined together to become Charter members of the Twin Lakes Riding Club. They immediately started enjoying activities with a trail ride and picnic lunch on November 5th followed by a Gymkhana show at a member's home on November 12th. Their next activity was a dance for the members on December 8th. Various other activities took place the following year.

In December of 1962 that year the club members banded together with other horse people and livestock owners to appear before the County Planning Commissioners to protest rezoning of some 30 square miles of Northern Sacramento County. The proposed zoning would have changed most of Fair Oaks, Citrus Heights, and Orangevale from agricultural to residential status.

Over the next few years, the club participated in many parades and in Orangevale's "Fiesta Days" Celebrations. In 1964, the Club leased land from Mr. and Mrs. Glen Fellion for \$1.00 per year and proceeded to build an arena with volunteer labor from the TLRC members. The membership by this time was over 40 families. The arena was located across Excelsior from the present location. Their first actual horse show was on April 16th of that year and over 200 people turned out to watch the show.

In 1965 the club was going strong. They then built a snack shack and bleachers; purchased a duplicating machine and started publishing a monthly newspaper; built "his" and "hers" portables; bought hoses and water sprinklers; installed arena lights for night practice and shows; built a sign-up booth; and leased parking area on their present arena sight for about 60 trailers. This same year, the Club had their first overnight barbecue trail ride in Grass Valley (enjoyed by 75 members). The highlight trail ride of the year began with a week-long vacation at Wright's Lake.

By July of 1966, the membership had grown to 94 families. In 1967 they had crowned the TLRC Queen and formed a Color Guard for Governor's Night at the State Horse show. In 1969, Orangevale changed "Fiesta Days" to "Pow Wow Days" and TLRC sponsored a 2-day horse show. The Club also purchased the ground where their present arena and facilities are currently located. In 1970, Broom Polo was introduced to the club along with the first trail ride to Sand 'N' Surf in San Francisco.

Horse shows, trail rides, dances, family fun days, dinners, picnics and parades are some of their activities to this day.

The general meetings for

the Club are held on the first Wednesday of each month. In the winter months the meetings are currently held at the Orangevale Library. During the rest of the year the meetings are held outdoors at their arena location.

The Club has arena rules, a Constitution and By-Laws that each member is furnished with and made aware of. Each new member family attends three meetings before being voted into the club by the membership at a regular general meeting. An initiation fee is paid along with annual dues which can be paid annually or semiannually. The initiation fee is paid only once unless you drop your membership and later return.

Initially, for parades the club voted to wear dark blue jeans, white hats, white shirts, red ties and white blankets on the horses trimmed with red tassels. Later, red vests with silver studs were added to the costume. A contest was held to design a decal the club now uses on the sides of their trailers and trucks with a lovely picture of a horse head and the club's name.

The Club membership had been as high as 165 families and as low as 34 families. The club activities provide an interesting calendar for the entire year. Horse shows and trail rides are normally held during the spring, summer, and fall. During the winter activities are strictly social events for the members. The club strives to be fair and just always!!

I listened to interviews with

TLRC members, and they did not know where the first arenas for the horse shows were held. The first show was on Mountain Ave in a section of a pasture. The man had acreage and he let them use the area. It had no fences. Th second show was at the dead end of Hickory heading north. No road to it, they just took the fence down and drove over the culvert. The third arena was behind Jane Falting not a vast area, toward the church and they held several shows. She believes she later sold the land to the riding club.

Does anyone remember these properties before the club was officially formed. Her parents were Jak ad Eloie Moore who started the Pow Wow Days and owned several businesses in Orangevale. He felt the children needed a place to show and ride their horses.

Newly formed in early 2022, the Orangevale History Project (OHP) has a mission to preserve, chronicle and promote the history of Orangevale, and to educate our community. Come Spring of 2023, the Orangevale Recreation & Park District provided a building and our generous community provided the labor and donations to help transform a small parsonage house into its first History Museum that opened in July, 2023.

OHP has been assembling materials for long-term preservation and the documentation of Orangevale history. Both the Fowler Family and Mary Henter have added to their family collections which will be on exhibit to provide a more complete picture of what it was like to live in this northern part of Sacramento County.

One of our new exhibitions features items used in the home – for work, play, food preparation and because you just got to have shoes. Visitors can also see fruit packing crates, a vintage record player, and albums.

Throughout the first year, OHP has also sought to document the business history of the area. With that in mind, OHP is working with the owners of The Boardwalk, Sara Green and Derek Clark, to showcase the dynamic story of this musical venue.

Come join us to celebrate the Museum's first anniversary at our free Ice Cream Social at the Orangevale History Museum to be held Saturday, July 13, 2024, from 3-5pm. There will be new exhibits showing Orangevale's history, two interactive touchscreens, a gift shop, music and fun with a trivia game! The Museum is located at 6920 Hazel Avenue, just north of the Orangevale Community Center. Turn right into the driveway through the gate and continue to the far-right building. The free admission Museum is open Tues, Thurs, and Sat from 12-4pm, except for it being closed on July 4th and 11th. It is officially summer! With the 4th of July around the corner, you may be wondering what to serve for your celebration. I have the perfect recipe for a side dish! My sister, Sally, whipped up this dish for our Father's Day meal last week. It was so yummy and I didn't even realize that the green was kale! SALLY'S PASTA SALAD

1 lb. Bowtie Pasta
1//3 cup pine nuts
¼ cup olive oil
6 cloves garlic, minced
½ tsp salt
½ tsp pepper
1 bunch kale, chop into bite
sized pieces

4 oz parmesan cheese, shaved 2 TBSP balsamic vinegar (optional)

(The pine nuts, salt, pepper, parmesan cheese and vinegar can be adjusted to your taste)

Cook pasta according to package directions. Drain, rinse with cold water, and add to a large bowl. Set aside.

Add pine nuts to a small skillet over low heat. Toast slowly over the course of 5-10 minutes, tossing regularly until lightly browned on all sides. You must keep an eye

on this because they are easy to burn. Remove from the skillet and set aside.

In a large skillet, heat olive oil and garlic over low heat so that the garlic slowly infuses the oil. When the oil starts to cause the garlic to sizzle, stir around so the garlic doesn't get too brown. When garlic starts to turn golden, add salt and pepper, stir, and set aside for 5 minutes

After 5 minutes, pour the oil mixture (scraping the salt, pepper, and garlic) all over the bowtie pasta. Toss to combine and set aside.

Set the same skillet (without cleaning it) over mediumhigh heat. Add the kale and cook for 5 minutes, or until partly wilted.

Add kale and pine nuts to the pasta and toss it all together. Check to make sure it's no longer warm, then add Parmesan shavings and toss. If you would like to add vinegar, add here. Taste for seasonings and add more salt and pepper if needed.

Chill for at least 2 hours before serving. Serves 12.
Makes great leftovers!



The support we received from the Orangevale Recreation and Parks District and a small group of dedicated students helped us weather the shutdown brought on by the CO-VID-19 pandemic. Working collaboratively with OVParks we converted our training to online and when permissible used outdoor space at the OV Youth Center and OV Community Center. The school has returned to its pre-COVID numbers and is always welcoming new students.

Classes are held Tuesday and Thursday evenings and Saturday mornings at the OV Youth Center. Classes are offered for all beginning at age 7. Family classes and discounts are also available. 


