California's Road Charge Plan: More Burden, Less Freedom By Sue Frost

This summer, as Californians prepare for road trips and vacations, I wanted to share my thoughts on the Road Charge Collection Pilot, a mileage-based tax program designed to help fund road maintenance. This pilot program offers drivers the chance to voluntarily sign up and test a new funding approach, where they pay a set fee for each mile driven or a fee based on their vehicle's fuel efficiency. The program is set to run from August 2024 to January 2025.

In 2014, the California legislature passed SB 1077 to research a road charge system. involving over 5,000 vehicles and documenting 37 million miles of travel. The study proposed a shift to a per-mile charge to distribute road maintenance costs among all drivers, regardless of their vehicle's fuel efficiency.

Historically. road maintenance has been funded through the gas tax when vou buy fuel, and a portion of that expense helps maintain our roads. However. as electric vehicles (EVs), which bypass traditional fuel consumption, become more prevalent, revenue from this tax has been declining. The proposed state solution is to charge drivers based on the miles they drive.

Although this may seem

fair on paper, it's important to consider the potential negative impacts. Firstly, charging by the mile could potentially increase your costs, especially when you're planning vacations or visiting relatives. This might discourage some from traveling, potentially affecting our state's tourism industry.

Another concern is privacy. If this pilot program were adopted nationwide, how would mileage be tracked and reported without infringing on individual privacy? How much would it cost to administer the tax.

Additionally, this mileagebased tax could impact lower and middle-income families. Those who rely on their vehicles for daily commutes. especially in less fuel-efficient vehicles or from remote areas, might find this system feels like a double tax, disproportionately affecting them. How is that fair?

Lastly, California's push to move to electric vehicles by 2045 presents some infrastructure challenges. For instance. last summer's heatwaves led to blackouts that disrupted EV charging, indicating that our current infrastructure may not yet be equipped to support a fully electric future.

While the Road Charge Collection Pilot has good intentions, its unintended consequences could place an extra burden on hardworking residents. Instead of creating more tax burdens, we should focus on managing our money better and prioritizing the use of funding.

The lot at 9426 Greenback Lane was originally planned and built as a 1-story, 2-bedroom house.

In March 1955, William (Bill) C. and Elizabeth (Betty) M. Asher filed for a Notice of Intention to Engage in the Sale of Alcoholic Beverages (aka liquor license) at 9426 Greenback Lane. William's Place at this location opened in May. It was a popular place for food, music, and dancing, featuring Vern Henderson and His Western Dance Band, and Curly Choates and His Rhythm Kings. They also opened a card room.

In June 1963, Jack P. and Yvonne F. Breitweiser acquired a liquor license and in August 1964, the grand opening of the Aquarium Lounge was announced. It became known as The Aquarium Club and people could be entertained and dance to the music of Dale Owen and the Casuals. Country and Western music was provided every Friday and Saturday night starring Bill Floyd and His Southland Serenaders and Clyde Anderson and Don Reynolds.

On April 22, 1965, the Announcement "To the Creditors of Aquarium Club, Notice of Intention of Bulk Transfer to be made by Jack R. and Yvonne F. Breitwiser, under the business name Aquarium Club to Edgar L and Betty L. Lord". That same day the Lord's filed for a liquor license, and on June 3, 1965, a Notice of Fictitious Names Change to Cow Town was filed.

October 31, 1969 – The Grand Reopening of Cow Town (under New Management) was announced, and all attendees could get free buck stew while listening to Jim Weeks and the Cow Towners.

In March 1975, a petition was filed in Opposition to Cowtown. The pe-

nuisance and a disturbance of the peace. While no outcome from the petition occurred, in October 1975 it was announced that Dick Dashnaw and Tom Vinci would be the new hosts at Cowtown. They would be open 7 days a week from 9am to 2am, with a private card room open Wednesday through Sunday. Dick Dashnaw and his Nashville Fever provided music for listening and dancing. Additional performers included: Vince Tempest, Roger (Ramjet) Quick, Roger Resler, and Tammy Leens. Dick's wife, Pat was the head bartender with Don Gaines as her right-hand person. The menu featured steaks, burgers, and stew, but cook Pat Newquist's chili was from an 85-year-old recipe that was tough to beat. That year the New Year celebration featured the well-known Nashville Fever.

On June 17, 1979, saw the grand opening of the new Country In with host and hostesses Dick & Pat and John & Robin. The Country Lites provided Live Music. The band played a variety of music, including the cha-cha and samba but specialized in country and country rock. The members were Jim, on steel, Lyle on drums, Dick, lead man singer, and Robin on bass and singer. Several renovations of the club occurred at this time including a new carpet, bar, and stage plus repaneled walls, and enhanced lighting. The large wood dance floor was a highlight of the club.

The Country In changed hands when in September 1980 – Public Notice No. 538: Notice of Application for Change in Ownership of Alcoholic Beverage License was filed by Thomas Lee Kimble and Janice M. Linker. That ownership and change was short-lived as in May 1981, James D. Beauchamp and Lorene R. Richardson filed for a liquor license and a Fictitious Business Name Statement – Doing Business as The Staggering Bull. The business partnership grew to include James D. Beauchamp, Gordon R.

Kirkpatrick, Lorene Richardson as General Partners and Peggy M. Crow, Lee J. Fletcher, Louis Galanis, Charles Joerg as Limited Partners. The name of the club returned to being known as Cow Town and over the next few years featured Tommy Overstreet, Bow Howdy Band, Davey London and The Rainbow Riders, Quickdraw, and Buddy McDonel and the Country Forecast. September 4, 1986, announced the grand opening of the Grapevine by Marc Cooper, a musician himself, he said "This is totally for the musicians. My main reason for doing this is to give local musicians a place to play and to have a place where my friends can hang out." Lending a hand to get the club ready were members of bands such as Jet Red. Siren, Stolen, the newest Charlie Peacock Group, the Nerv and Panther. Panther played during the club's first weekend. Other wellknown local bands, such as Steel Breeze, the Rutabagas and Tesla (formerly City Kidd) offered their performing skills at greatly reduced rates. In 3 weeks, all walls, even the bar were acoustically padded and upholstered, pillars veneered and painted, kitchenette was added, and a dressing room and sound booth were built.

Cooper came to the club after he heard through a mutual friend that Dave Kelley, who owned the business, was in danger of losing it and was interested in letting someone use the space for a club. The deal would give Kelley the bar totals and Cooper the food concession and cover charge.

The Grapevine introduced an opportunity for Mark Earl and Michale Lorenzo who in 1987 opened the doors and revitalized the Cow Town of years ago to a new club called Rodeo Joe's. They held country jam sessions which featured local musicians and on Fridays and Saturdays the band Borderline, formerly the Country Cowboys performed. In October, Mark D. Earl filed for a liquor license, and In December of the following year, The Boardwalk opened with him as sole owner.

Over the next 35 years, local, national, and international bands appeared at The Boardwalk. The 1990's brought many bands such as Cheap Trick, Dokken, Emerald City, Foghat, Great White, Jackyl, Joan Jett & the Blackhearts, Leon Russell, Marshall Crenshaw, Quiet Riot, Robin Trower, Sedona, Social Distortion, Steve Howe, and Wolf-

gang Press.

In 1998 the club underwent a face-lift getting a new carpet, lights, speakers built into the stage, and a drum riser. For a short span of 1999, The Boardwalk slid into a country format but by the end of the year returned to hard rock.

Some of the bands from the 2000's were A.D.D., A Skylit Drive, Aroarah, Brand X Savior, Dance Gavin Dance, Drowning Adam, Eric Martin, Five Minute Ride, Frank Hannon (of Tesla), Key to Arson, Lit, Living Colour Low Flying Owls, Mercy Playground, Nils Lofgren, Robby Kreiger (formerly with The Doors), Secretions, Still Life Project, Tesla, Testament, The Skirts, Tony Levin and Unwritten Law.

From 2010 to 2022, there were too many bands to list here. To view the legacy page and find your favorites, visit The Boardwalk's website at: www.rocktheboardwalk.com. You'll also find a list of all upcoming events.

Following the 2020 death of Mark Earl, Sandy Silk-Earl placed the building up For Sale in April 2021 with the intent of only selling to a buyer who would keep it a music venue. And, in January 2022, The Boardwalk permanently closed.

The revival of The Boardwalk in October 2022 comes thanks to Derek Clark and Sara Green who also own the local Palm Brewing Company. Since opening featured bands have included Blood Red Sky, Fastball, Maidens of Metal, Red Voodoo Richie Ramone, Riff Raff, Sleep Signals, The Darbies, The Red Jumpsuit Apparatus, Viva Santana, and White Winged Dove. The Boardwalk offers food, cocktails, and entertainment from Thursday through Sunday.

Derek and Sara have personally donated hundreds of thousands of dollars to non-profits and all door profits from concerts are donated to local and regional non-profits particularly focused on helping families, veterans, and pets at risk.

If The Boardwalk is mentioned in a crowd you are guaranteed to hear stories that start with "I remember when...", I saw _____ there...", "Did you know....". During my research for this story, I have read a lot and spoken to many. Thanks for sharing your stories.

ROLLINGWOOD YMCA CELEBRATES ITS GOLD MEDAL PICKLEBALL WINNERS

The Olympics are about to get off the ground in Paris, but two Rollingwood members have already taken home the gold! Mike Boyce and Bill Gunning were undefeated in the senior men's doubles in the recent Professional Pickleball Association (PPA) Veolia Sacramento Open Play, held at Life Time Fitness in Roseville.

PPA tournaments are where the pros play, so the event draws a huge crowd and lots of players. In this year's Sacramento Open, over 900 participants of varying skill levels were on hand, including Anna Leigh Walters, Catherine Parenteau and Ben Johns, leading names in professional pickleball.

To earn their gold, Boyce and Gunning participated with four other teams of two men each in their division. Teams played every other team for a total of four games. Unlike a traditional pickleball game which is played to 11 points with a win by 2, these games (like most tournaments) were played to 15.

"While the competition was stiff," Boyce noted, "the greatest challenge was the 103-degree temperature. We had to stay hydrated and find cool spots to rest between games to avoid heat stroke. The heat was so intense that there were three medical emergencies during the day."

Boyce and Gunning won their first game 15-14 and continued their winning streak to secure the top spot in the medal round. The top three teams then competed for gold, silver, and bronze. Boyce and Gunning remained undefeated throughout the day, ultimately taking home the gold.

Despite their impressive performance, Boyce and Gunning had not been longtime partners. They met while playing at Rusch Park in Citrus Heights not long ago. "Mike and I seemed to gel, so I asked him to be my partner for the upcoming PPA tournament," Gunning shared.

He added, "Success in pickleball often depends on how well you work together. Two skilled players might not play well as a team, but if you both know the game and who will do what, it generally flows. It certainly did in our case"

Dedicated pickleball enthusiasts, Boyce and Gunning have competed



in many other tournaments. However, they emphasize that it's not just about winning. "Besides the enjoyment of the game, pickleball is a lot of fun and a great way to make new friends," Boyce said.

In Fair Oaks, the Rollingwood YMCA has become a popular spot for pickleball. Pickleball Coordinator Karla Allen started the program in 2020. Today, there are over 300 registered Rollingwood pickleball players of all ages. The YMCA offers pickleball classes and private lessons for evervone - members and non-members alike. INGREDIENTS

1/2 a cucumber (peeled, quartered lengthwise and chopped

1 honey crisp apple (peeled, cored and sliced-n-diced) 1/4 red onion (diced or sliced. you choose)

2 Roma tomatoes (diced) Fresh cilantro (4 or 5 sprigs, chopped-do you know the colander trick? no stems just leaves)

(Thread the cilantro stems through a colander's hole pulling them through, the leaves will stay in the colander, and you can toss the stems)

3 garlic cloves (minced or chopped fine)

6 or 7 good size cashews, chopped finely or chunkyyour choice

Dressing ingredients: (or you could just use store bought balsamic dressing) 1/8 cup apple cider vinegar 1/8 cup extra virgin olive oil (use the good stuff. I used a Place fruit, veggies, and nuts garlic infused one)

1/2 Tbsp mustard (use Dijon if you have it or use good old vellow French's)

1/3 cup raw honey. You can more of less or not at all. I love the sweet n tanginess. I may have used more

1/8 tsp cayenne. Spice it up with 1/4 tsp

1/8 tsp garlic powder or garlic salt, you choose

Whisk well in a bowl until it comes together with no mustard floaters. Refrigerate for 20 minutes, if possible, but okay if you can't.

Add salt and pepper if needed (This dressing also makes a good shot to start your day before coffee or breakfast. Really fires up your metabolism)

Pour dressing all over that stuff

Sprinkle cilantro and mix well to make sure everything gets a blessing of dressing Serve or chill for 30 minutes


