From Main Avenue to Yokohama: How I Embarked on a Life-Changing Journey to Japan

(And how you can too)

In 2023, when I first applied to study abroad during my junior year at Sacramento State University, I thought I would be immediately rejected—or, if selected by the program coordinators, unable to participate due to financial constraints. I had no idea that a year and a half later, I would be playing shogi in the student union at Yokohama National University while explaining the deep meaning behind English onomatopoeias (they were fascinated by the expression "cock-a-doodle-doo") to Japanese students.

As someone who grew up in Orangevale, I never imagined my education journey would lead me halfway across the world. This experience was made possible through a year-anda-half battle with Sac State bureaucracy and, more importantly, the Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship. Sponsored by the U.S. Department of State, the Gilman program enables students of limited financial means to study or intern abroad, equipping them with skills critical to national security and economic prosperity. The program also encourages students to study languages, offering additional awards to those pursuing "critical needs languages" such as Arabic,

Chinese, Russian, and Japanese.

Thanks to the Gilman Scholarship, I was able to cover the costs of living abroad in Japan during my senior year and have a life-changing experience. If you're a college student considering studying abroad—wherever that may be—I strongly recommend applying for the Gilman International Scholarship. Even if you're not a college student but are studying a foreign language or know someone who is, I encourage you or them to apply. The program is especially committed to supporting veterans and first-generation college students. It may just change your life.

All the Modern Conveniences

A Reminiscence From Interview with Prosper Tomich Children in 1978 By Margaret Tomich McAllister

Orangevale was rather progressive in the 1920s, surprising for a community that was mostly farmlands and 30 miles from the hustle-bustle of Sacramento. We had piped water, electric lights and telephones!

Not even our downtown relatives had clean water all the time. When the river was running wild, the water was so full of sediment, you couldn't even take a bath! Out in Orangevale, you could go out to the orchard, drop down on your belly and drink right out of the irrigation ditch. It was that clean! Of course, it wasn't perfect all year round; an occasional pollywog in the middle of the winter was to be expected. But nobody ever got sick.

When water was piped into the kitchen, it made Mama's life easier. When the bathroom was put in, it was like a miracle! No more leaping out of bed in the dead of winter and running to the outhouse and back before your parts froze off. Nope, now we had a toilet, basin and bathtub in one room, right at the foot of the stairs. Of course, the best part was when the man came out to the house to build the septic tank. He showed up with a load of dynamite and proceeded to blast holes in the ground where the tank was supposed to go. Nick, Jack and Quentin hollered and jumped up and down with each blast. Freddie's eyes got big before he buried his face in Mama's skirt. And little Tommie squealed with each enormous blast. It was a great day in Orangevale!

The following year, Daddy had a telephone put in. They installed it on the wall by the front door. It was an object of fascination for Frances who was just big enough to stretch up and touch it, anticipating the day when she would be allowed to use it. It was a source of irritation for Freddie who was just tall enough to bump his head regularly on the little writing shelf. And it was a matter of principle for Nick who was old enough to use it but couldn't understand why he'd want to. "When I want to talk to somebody, I can walk over and see them," he proclaimed just beginning to develop opinions about everything. Years of tromping over to the neighbors went by before he learned to use it. Thereafter, he spoke of its virtues and adopted a whole new attitude toward all the modern conveniences vet to come.

One day in 1923, Lyle Coan showed up to "wire the house." We had no idea what that meant, but Daddy did. So, there was Lyle asking Mama to borrow her broom. The whole family watched, engrossed, as he walked from room to room with his head toward the heavens and a broom in his hand. When he had come full circle back to the living room, he walked over to the corner and held the broom at the throat of its bristles and pointed it toward the opposite corner. Looking down its length with

one eye squeezed shut he announced, "that's the middle, that's where the light goes." So, Daddy put a mark on the ceiling. Then Lyle was inside and outside, boring holes and running wires. Pretty soon a wire was dangling from the hole in the living room ceiling with a socket at the end and a white globe screwed into it. He repeated this procedure in every room until the house was fully "wired." Then he added one push button switch near the front door that worked that light and the one in the living room. All the other lights had drop cords hanging like limp cattails next to the frosted white globes. When he was done, he flipped the switch and the white globes glowed, throwing light over each room like a sudden sunrise. That's when we knew we had a modern system. No question about it!

- •Content: Cards should be homemade, filled with love, and free from sharp glitter or any other materials that could be harmful to seniors.
- •No Personal Information: Please do not include personal contact information or identifying details. The cards should only include a first name, or "from your neighbor".
- •No Envelopes Needed: Envelopes are not required as cards will be distributed in bulk to various facilities, but they are much appreciated as a donation for our Easter program.

OVEN BAKED HAM AND SWISS SLIDERS

1-12 count package Kings Hawaiian Rolls 1/2 cup butter melted 1/2 tsp ground mustard 1 tsp poppy seeds 1 tsp Worcestershire sauce 1 package Swiss cheese 12-16oz thin sliced ham (or leftover ham from the holidays!)

Slice the rolls in half, horizontally. Place bottom half in a 9 x13 pan and put ham and cheese on sliced rolls. Cover the ham and cheese with the top half of the rolls. Mix all other ingredients together and spoon over sandwiches. Cover with foil and refrigerate overnight or for several hours. Bake at 350 for 15 minutes before serving.

Note from Suzanne: Caution! These are so delicious you might want to eat the entire pan. The flavor is so delicious and unique! Enjoy.







"We are thankful to Casa Roble for partnering with us on the greenhouse," said Lacey. "It has been essential for us to grow healthy, thriving vegetables to support local families."

The greenhouse provides significant benefits to the farm. Its climate-controlled environment, with probes and heating pads, offers ideal temperatures for plant growth. The team has perfected the soil and fertilizer to eliminate bugs and pathogens, while the enclosed space keeps birds and pests out, protecting the fragile seeds.

Resident Kathy Avakian has been the farm's lead green-house volunteer. Her dedication to the greenhouse underscores its importance to the farm, and one of her favorite parts is working alongside students in the spring during their plant sale.

"I love being part of a team that nourishes our community," Kathy said. "We get to start the vegetables at the greenhouse, nourish them at the farm, and then they get



harvested."

The greenhouse's impact extends beyond the Food Bank Farm. Kathy uses her education and training to support local gardeners through the Orangevale Farm and Garden Club and by distributing extra seeds at events and community stands.


